## MEALS, ACCOMMODATIONS, AND TRAVEL

#### Meals and Socials:

Continental breakfasts at The Works Hotel are included in the price of the room. Three lunches and the May 7 dinner are included in the regular registration fee. Registrants are welcome at the hotel hospitality suite (Room 211), the May 7 noon informal reception, and the May 8 reception by the Northern Indiana Historical Society Museum. Dinner on May 8 is on your own; a list of moderately-priced and better restaurants in downtown South Bend will be provided to registrants. There is a restaurant in The Works Hotel. Be sure to register for the banquet; this is in addition to the basic registration fee.

#### Lodging:

A block of fifty rooms has been reserved at The Works Hotel in South Bend for those attending this conference. This comfortable new hotel is located in an entirely renovated and modernized 1830 brick building one block from the St. Joseph River. The special room rates for the French Colonial Historical Society are \$43.00 for a single and \$50.00 for a double, plus 10% sales tax. Additional persons are \$7.00 plus tax. Please fill out and mail the enclosed reservation postcard to The Works Hotel at your earliest convenience since rooms not reserved by April 15 will be released by the hotel for use by general public. To make your reservation either return the enclosed card (remember to place a postage stamp on the card) or call 219-234-1954.

#### Travel:

For those traveling by air, South Bend's Michiana Regional Airport is served by seven major airlines, with direct air connections from Chicago, Denver, Dayton, Cincinnati, Detroit, Indianapolis, and Washington, D.C. The enclosed editorial from the South Bend Tribune provides additional details.

Taxi service from the South Bend airport to The Works Hotel (on Niles Avenue near Madison Avenue) costs about \$7.00 for one or two passengers with each additional passenger costing about \$1.50. The Yellow Taxi Cab Company (233-9333) has been found to be reliable.

For those traveling by **train**, South Bend is served by its own AMTRAK station and the AMTRAK station at Niles, Michigan, about 35 minutes by car from The Works Hotel. There is a direct train, the International, between Toronto and Niles. If you are coming by train (to either the South Bend or Niles station), please write to Professor Joseph L. Peyser, Indiana University at South Bend, P.O. Box 7111, South Bend, Indiana 46634 to arrange for free transportation to and from the train station.

For those coming by Greyhound or Trailways Buses, the South Bend terminal is at the Michiana Regional Airport, where taxi service is available to the hotel.

For those coming by automobile, South Bend is on Exit 77 of the Indiana Toll Road (Interstate 80 and 90) and on State Highway 31 from Indianapolis. To drive to the hotel from Exit 77 of the Toll Road, go south on Business 31/33 about 3½ miles to LaSalle Street, turn left (east), cross the river, go to the first traffic light (Niles Avenue), turn left (north) and go 1½ blocks to the hotel, just north of Madison Avenue. From Indianapolis, going north on 31, do not take the 31 Bypass, but stay northbound on Business 31/33 to LaSalle Street, turn right (east) on LaSalle and proceed as in the preceding sentence.

South Bend's **TRANSPO** runs frequent buses on its convenient routes within the city, but car pooling and several university vehicles will be utilized to provide transportation between the hotel and IUSB, about two miles away. A bus has been chartered for the May 8 motor tour of French Colonial Michiana.

All sessions, except dinners and receptions, will be held at Indiana University at South Bend in the Management Training Center, located in the lower level of the Administration Building, 1700 Mishawaka Avenue. See attached maps for directions.


